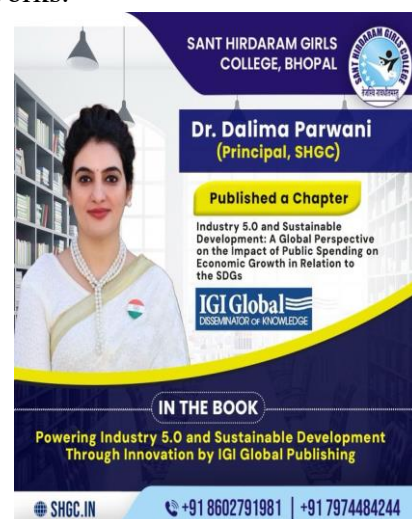
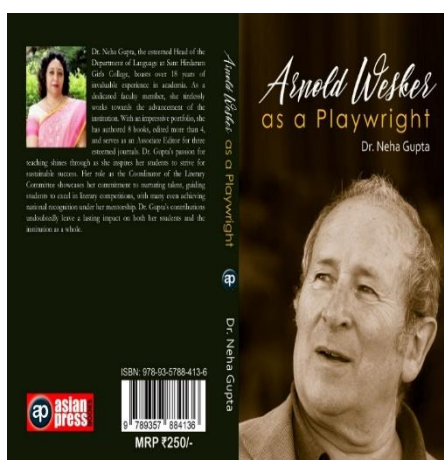

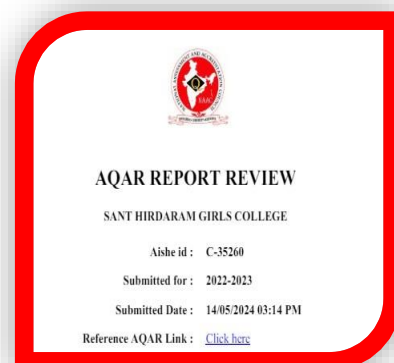
3. Institutional Growth and Quality Assurance
