# **World Breastfeeding Week**



bagged third prize.








# Women Empowerment through Competitive Exams Preparation at SHGC

The visit began from Modi University where the Pro. Vice Chancellor & Damp; the Registrar interacted and shared that documentation (Record maintenance) part plays a pivotal role while NAAC Peer Team Visit. For each and every activity, keeping records is of utmost importance. Having emotional attachment with the staff and among the staff helps in efficiency building and better retention.

At Banathali University, the personal secretary of VC gave the highlights and shared that it was the experience and foresightedness of Shastriji, the Ex-VC, that Vidhyapith is known overall India and has earned its recognition throughout in all academic and co-academic areas with 20,000 enrolments from the Country and Abroad. The campus is fully residential spread over 850 acres of land and is exclusively for Women, with a blend of traditional and modern programmes including Shastri (Veda), M.A, MSc (biotech, bioinfo, elect, textile, computer, pharma etc.) MCA, M.Tech, LLM, MBA, M.Com, B.Tech, B.Des, B.Pharm, B.Sc Aviation, B.Arc, Integrated Law etc. A student admitted to the Banasthali Vidyapith has to compulsorily join a hostel. There are facilities to learn French and German as well.

Swimming, horse riding, flying, music, shooting etc. are the additional features under the fivefold model. It is compulsory to wear khadi for students and staff. It has tie up with overseas universities for student/faculty exchange and research. There is rigorous doctoral research programmes in various fields and strong emphasis on sponsored projects.
